The 1951 Gridiron season was a huge success for the Bulldogs as they rolled to another undefeated season under the direction of Coach Arch Petersen who was ably assisted by Hy Klein, John Kestner and Russell Rowe.

With a record of seven victories and two ties they where declared State Class C Champions for the third time in the last four years. The Brighton eleven concluded their competition in the League of Lakes with a tie for the Championship with Dexter. The Bulldogs finished their season in good class by defeating two strong Class B teams, first they defeated Northville in a bruising battle on the local field by the score of $21-13$, then in a muddy brawl they defeated Milford 7-0.

Next year the Bulldogs will be independent and in 1953 they will compete in the Wayne-Oakland League against such schools as Holly, Northville, Milford, Clarenceville, Clarkston and Keego Harbor.

The Junior Varsity was organized late in the year by Hy Klein and John Kestner and after losing their first game continued on their schedule winning their next three for a successful season.

Above is pictured the 1951-1952 edition of the Brighton High School Basketball team that was molded together by Coach Hy Klein in his first year at Brighton.

Coach Klein called the first practice session November 14 with 40 boys reporting. With the new gym not yet completed, the difficulty of securing a suitable place to practice produced a great handicap. This handicap had much effect on the team at the beginning of the season causing them to lose their first five games. The Bulldogs inaugurated the new gymnasium on January 29, 1952 when they defeated Clarkston $50-38$ opening a successful home stand. During this stand they won seven of nine games defeating such teams as Milford, Manchester, Dexter, South Lyons, Hartland, Clarkston, and Pinckney.

After losing their first four league games the Bulldogs came to life to win their last six league tilts and finish in a tie for second place.

In the District Tournament at Walled Lake in early March, the Bulldogs reached the finals when they defeated Hartland $40-34$ only to be defeated by a high ranking Keego Harbor team 68-41.

The Bulldogs main offensive weapon was their Captain and center Tom Evenson who scored 253 points during the regular season. Trailing him was Jack Wood with 88.

At a meeting following the close of the season the team honored Dick Stonex Tom Evenson by electing them to serve as co-captains during the 1952-1953 season.

The first basketball banquet in the history of Brighton High School was held April 22 in honor of the team, with Pete Newell, head basketball coach at Michigan State College as guest speaker.
