The queen's attendant was Bucillia Schrader at the Homecoming Game.


The annual Banquet was held in December and a large number of parents, students, and faculty members enjoyed the turkey dinner and entertainment offered by the class members.

In 1957 the record in league competition wasn't very good, but most of the sting of a poor season (9-10) was erased when the local boys won the District Championship by beating Milford and Howell.






