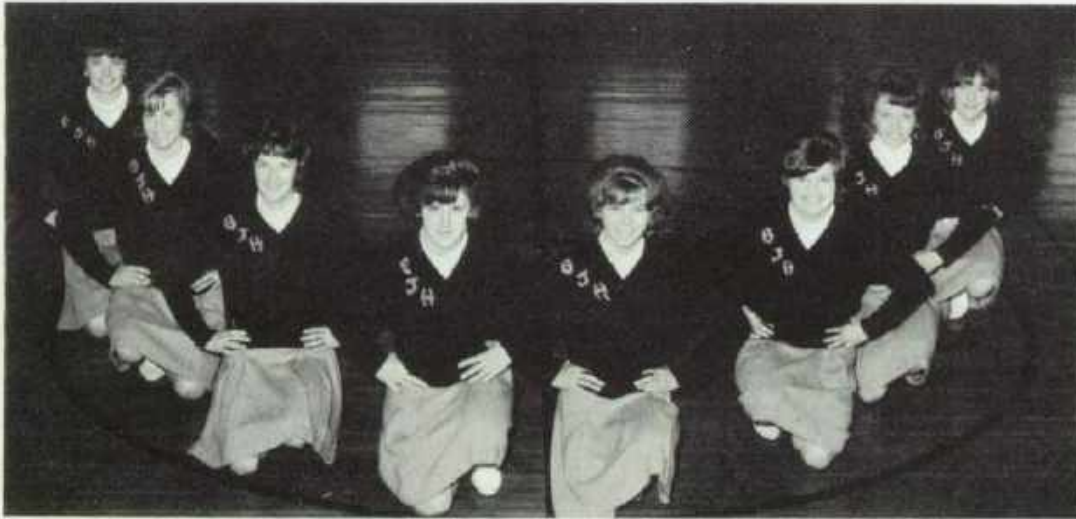

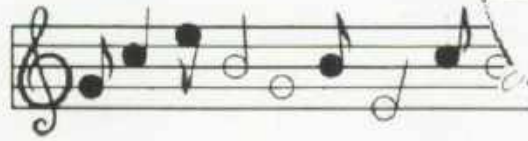

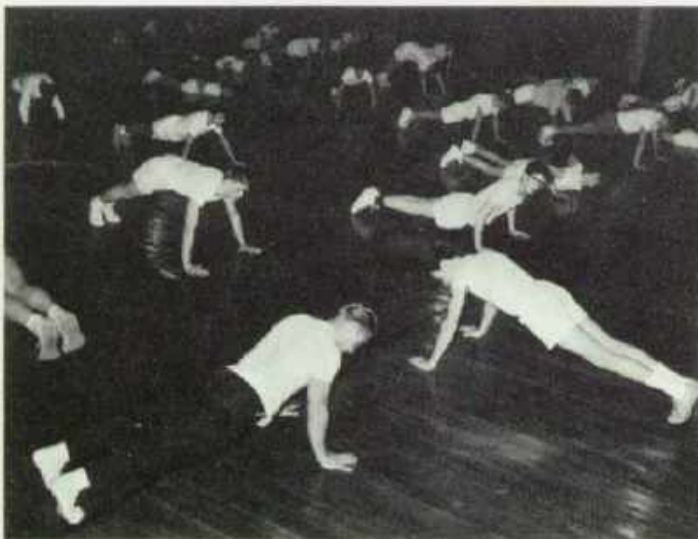
"ROW, ROW, ROW"

Pizza, Donut and Cookbook sales topped their money-making projects for the 1964-65 year.

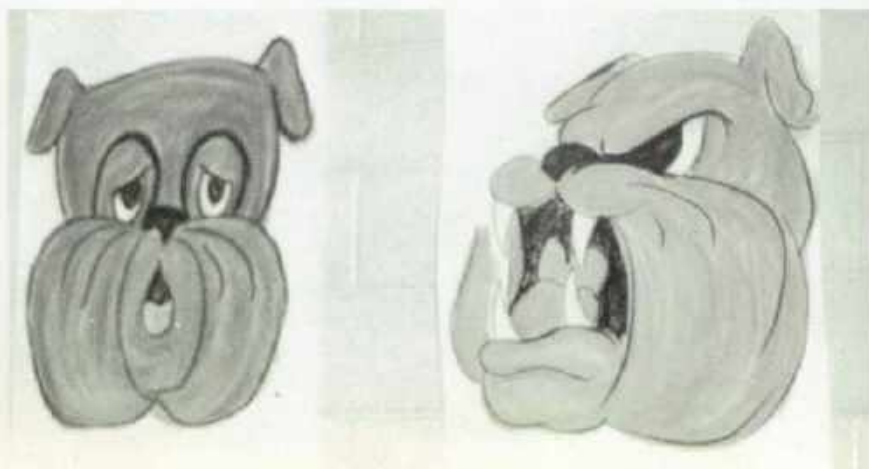
