1965 marked the end of 13 successful years as superintendent of the Brighton school system for H. GORDON HAWKINS. Under Mr. Hawkins' guidance rural schools were consolidated into the present Brighton Area district. He watched the construction of two elementary schools, one of which received his name, and saw the beginning of a new senior high building. During these years enrollment rose from 900 to 2500; the teaching staff increased from 35 to 89.

To Dewaine Shomin — American Indian

It is probable that no other Brighton class will have such a distinction—a potential Indian Chief of the Ottawa's or a class member at the White House in Washington pictured shaking hands with a president of the United States.
