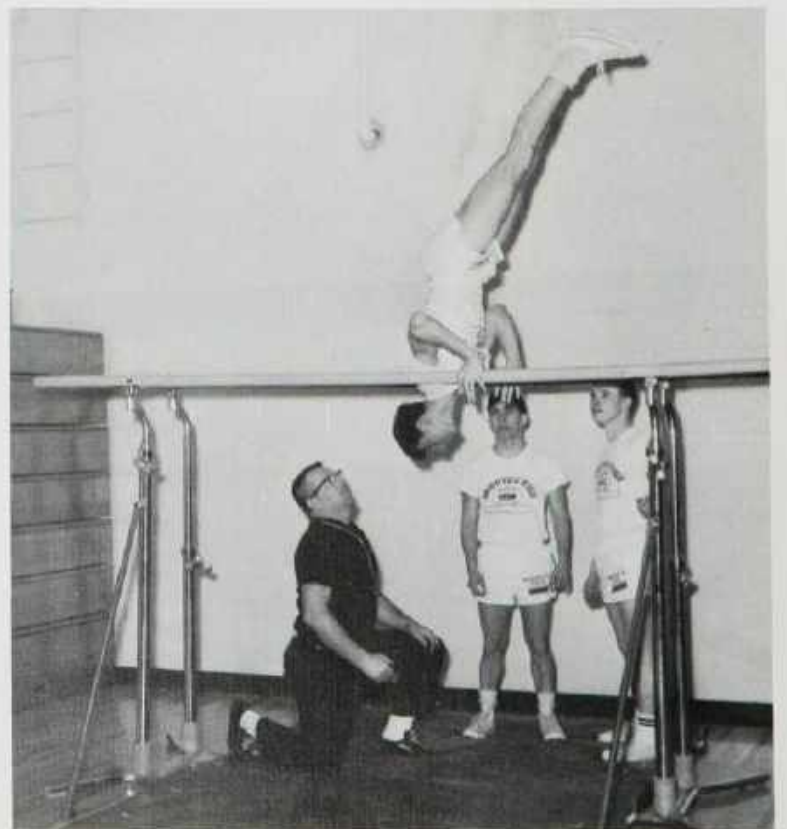


Physical Education
