

Dedication

George Prieskorn, ended nine years of teaching in the Brighton school system in 1968. He graduated from Brighton High School in 1953 and graduated from Michigan State in 1957. He was in the U.S. Army from 1958-1960, and was a First Lieutenant in the Artillery.

Mr. Prieskorn started teaching in February of 1960, at the junior high school. He then taught in the high school from the fall of 1960 thru 1968.

He was assistant football coach in 1960-1961, head football coach from 1962-1967, and, in 1967-1968, attendance officer and athletic director. Besides being a football coach, Mr. Prieskorn taught trigonometry, science, chemistry, senior math, and geometry, during his years of teaching. For all nine years he was the golf coach. In 1967-1968 year, Mr. Prieskorn's golf team placed second in the state.

His many accomplishments have won him great esteem both among the students and within his community. We dedicate this book to Mr. Prieskorn, as a tribute to his devoted years.
























## English

























#### Mathematics






## Social Studies






#### Sciences

































# Commercial Arts and Distributive Education


























#### Homecoming
